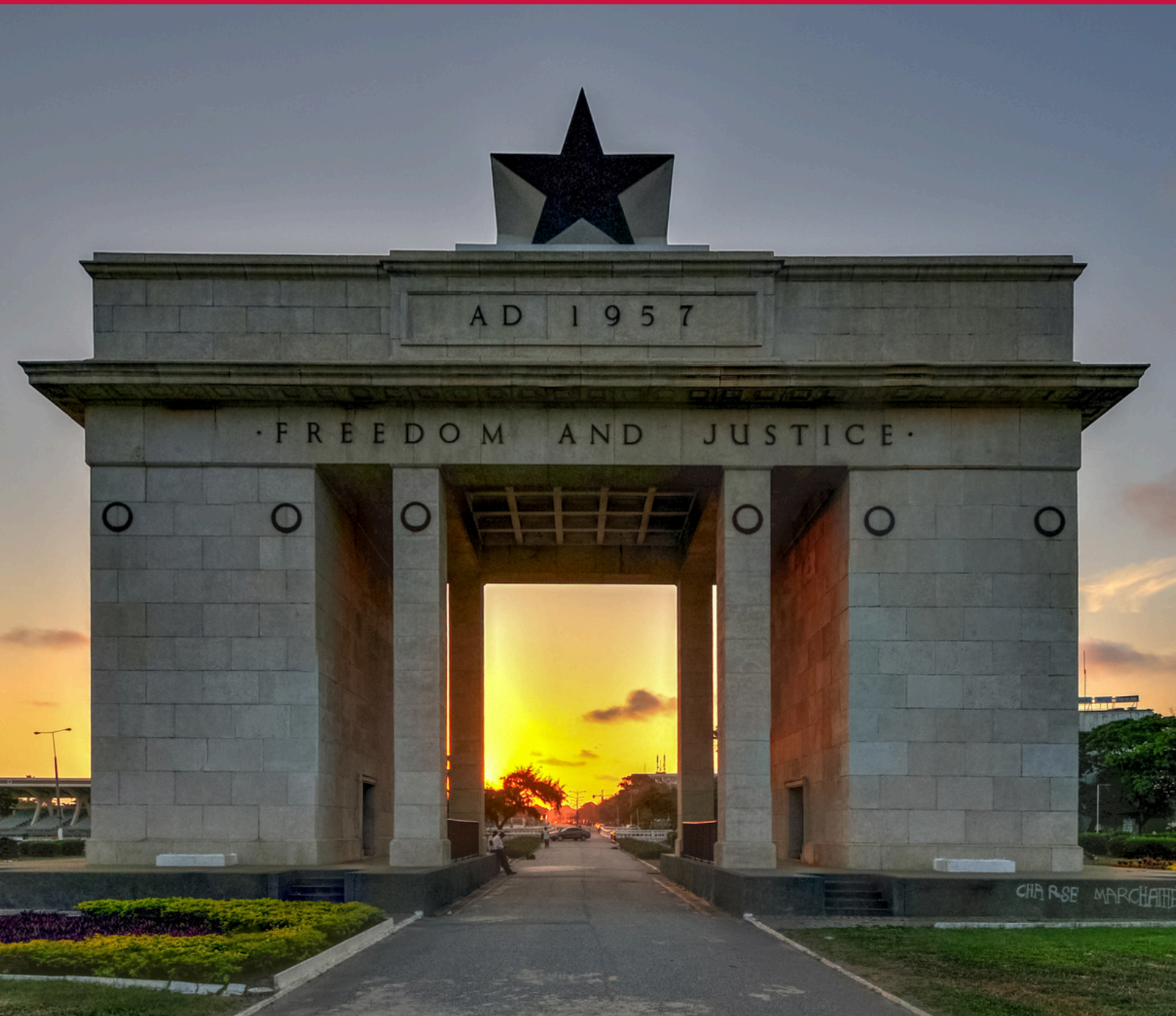

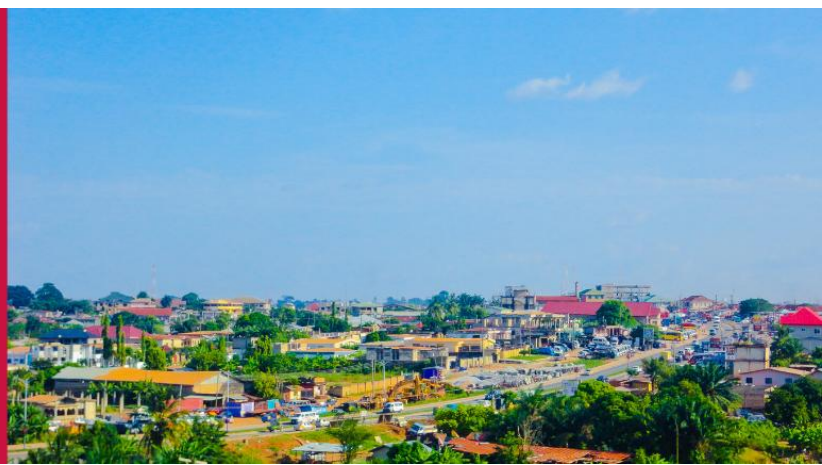

About the Tour

HOTELS

Your group will be housed in “superior tourist class hotels”. Since the star system doesn’t take into account location or atmosphere, ACFEA uses this definition to describe a property that is more comfortable, and better than an average tourist hotel.

CONCERTS

ACFEA will endeavor to create memorable opportunities for performance throughout the tour. While the venues on this tour are merely educated suggestions, they will be our first choice of space in each city. As opportunities arise, confirmations will follow, in consultation with the group’s artistic staff.

ACTIVITIES

A “guided sightseeing tour” is generally a two to three hour orientation by a professional local guide. If you see a note about an entrance being included, we have included admission, but if it merely is described as a visit, entry is free.

MEALS

Your tour includes daily breakfast and the lunches and dinners noted on the itinerary. You can expect a starter and a main course with dinner. Breakfast varies, but usually means a minimum of a cold buffet, coffee and tea. With exception of the wine-tasting, beverages apart from water are not included.

FLIGHTS

Flights between Rochester and Accra are included in the tour price.



FAQs

What is included in the tour price?

Your tour price includes 4 concerts, 2 service participations and 1 workshop, 11 nights of mid/high-level hotels with 2 people per room, breakfast daily plus other meals noted on the itinerary, roundtrip airfare from Rochester, coaching and ACFEA courier services throughout, plus all of the entrances and activities on the itinerary.

May I request a single room?

Yes. The Single Supplement is \$780. Request this under “Special Requirements” on Tour Central.

I want to do my own airfare. Can this be done?

Yes. Under “Special Requirements”, indicate that you want different air, and click on “Individual Travel Request”. Complete that form, so that ACFEA knows that you will not need air. The No-Air Reduction is estimated to be approximately \$1,600.

I want to fly on the group air, but I want to make a change. How do I do that?

Under “Special Requirements”, click on the Individual Travel Request form and complete it. ACFEA will receive your request and will contact you about schedule and pricing for your request.

Do you recommend travel insurance?

AN EMPHATIC YES! A link is available on Tour Central. IMPORTANT: You must purchase your policy within 14 days of trip deposit if you need coverage for any pre-existing conditions, or to be eligible for “Cancel for Any Reason” insurance. The deposit date is determined by when ACFEA cashes our first check, which will trigger your Tour Central invitation. If you have questions about insurance options, call USI at: (855) 874-0156.



Ghana Travel Requirements

Passport

Everyone going on tour needs a passport which is valid at least 6 months beyond the planned date of return and that has at least 1 blank page.

Tourist Visa

A tourist visa is required for US passport holders. A standard single entry visa is currently \$60. More guidance on when and how to apply individually will be provided in due course.

Vaxinations

Proof of Yellow Fever vaccination is required upon arrival in Ghana for anyone over nine months of age. Speak to your medical provided about this requirement and any questions you may have.

What Are the Next Steps?

The total estimated cost of this tour is \$6,700 per person and the final cost of the tour will depend on the final number of participants.

Once we have enough interest and have collected at minimum of 30 deposits, your deposit check will be cashed and becomes non-refundable. If the tour doesn’t reach the minimum registration requirement, your uncashed deposit check will be returned.

Once the tour is confirmed, ACFEA will enter your name into their website, Tour Central, and you will receive a welcome email.

Cost Details

The total estimated cost of this tour is \$6,700 per person and the final cost of the tour will depend on the final number of participants.

Payment Schedule

- October 19, 2026 – \$1,400 (estimated balance)

Cancellation Policy

- Deposit: Non Refundable
- Cancellation between Sep 19, 2025 & Nov 18, 2025: Deposit + \$500 (\$1,000 total)
- Cancellation between Nov 19, 2025 & Feb 18, 2026: Deposit + \$1,000 (\$1,500 total)
- Cancellation between Feb 19, 2026 & May 18, 2026: Deposit + \$1,500 (\$2,000 total)
- Cancellation between May 19, 2026 & Oct 18, 2026: Deposit + \$2,000 (\$2,500 total)
- Cancellation on or after Oct 19, 2026: FULLY NON REFUNDABLE
